Most people will hear, "depart from Me I never knew you. Your life contradicts what you professed to be." In these dire times people don't want God they just want to go to Heaven. Romans 5:8 But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

Ephesians 5:2 and walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

1 John 4:10 This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins.

Ephesians 6:8 because you know that the Lord will reward each one for whatever good they do, whether they are slave or free.

Matthew 5:19 Therefore anyone who sets aside one of the least of these commands and teaches others accordingly will be called least in the kingdom of
